Despite not being able to run the Christmas Fair in 2020 we were able to raise some funds through the Christmas Raffle, Christmas Cards, Class Calendars and the Sponsored Santa Walk.

The majority of funds requested by the school in the past 6 months has been used to purchase new ActivPanels (interactive white boards) for classrooms. The Parents Association originally purchased the interactive whiteboards in each classroom. They were a big investment and most are now nearing the end of their lives. They are being replaced by PA funds, where possible, when they can no longer be repaired. These are a very valuable tool in our children's learning and we are delighted to be able to do this, with your support.. Funds raised last year were also used to purchase a lot of additional books for September so all students could have their own copy of class books and they don't need to be shared.



In line with the school's healthy eating policy Santa brought Christmas annuals this year instead of selection boxes. We hope the children enjoyed them over the Christmas break.




Outdoor Classroom

A very exciting initiative undertaken this year between the Partnership Schools Committee/ Action Team for Partnership and the Parents' Association is the creation of an Outdoor Classroom. Planning is well underway with the expectation that it will be ready for use by classes before the end of the school year. The project has been funded by the sponsored Santa Walk in December, in conjunction with support from the Board of Management.

The plan is to make the space as attractive and multifunctional as possible so the whole school will benefit from it.

All classes will be able to use the classroom with their teachers and it will be available for some of the children to use at yard time. The seating and artificial grass surface will make it a pleasant alternative spot for children to follow occupations such as reading, chess, puzzles, and games. The children, led by the children on the Partnerships Schools Committee, are coming up with the ideas for using the space.

We would however be delighted with help making some structures such as raised beds and planters, equipment storage, benches, or seating. We are also hoping to add some stencils to our yard space and if any parent would be interested in some socially distant spray painting in the summer term, we would love to hear from you.
