REMINDERS

Leaving School Early

The teacher should be notified in advance if possible, should a child need to be collected early. Pupils who leave before the end of the school day, must be signed out at Reception by a parent/guardian.

If you need to collect your child during the school day, **please do not do so during break times (refer to table below.)** as the children are in the school yard at this time. If an <u>emergency situation</u> arises, please ring the office before break time and we will arrange to have your child at Reception.

Emails

As there are 850+ children in the school, can we please request that you include your **child's name**, **surname** and the **class teacher** in the subject line when emailing the school.

Birthday parties / Festivals etc

.If your child is having a birthday party and inviting children from the class, the distribution of invitations must be done outside school, as children who are not on the guest list can feel upset and isolated. Please do not ask school personnel for phone numbers or addresses of children in the class. Schools, like all institutions, must adhere to the terms of the Data Protection Act.

We celebrate festivals such as Halloween, Christmas, St. Patrick's Day and Easter as part of the overall school curriculum. However we discourage the practice of exchanging cards and/or gifts in school.Again, those who do not receive presents and those who may not celebrate some of the festivals feel upset and isolated."

Letters of Attendance

We would ask that if you require Letters of Attendance for Child Benefit/Travel/Visa purposes for your child/children, that you give the office **as much advance notice as possible**. Please

EMAIL your request to <u>info@stpatricksns.ie</u> stating the purpose of the letter. If it is for travel/visa request purposes, please advise date of departure so that the letter can be dated within a week of travel.

Passport Applications

The Principal, Deputy Principal, School Teachers and School Secretaries are permitted to witness Passport Applications for our school pupils. Passports are important legal documents so please do not take offence if you are asked by a member of staff for photo id. Please also note that both parents must sign the form in the presence of the staff member witnessing the application.

Procedure for entering the school each morning

The school bell rings at **08.30am**. Children walk to their lines.

Please note, classes are collected from the yard by their teacher. As soon as the classes have entered the building, the doors are closed.

- The Luttrellstown door (Door 4) remains open until 8.50am.
- Only children who arrive after 08.50am should enter via reception and sign the "late book".

Children may not enter the school building until 08.30am. Parents are responsible for the welfare of their children until the school's duty of care begins at 8.30 am. <u>On wet</u> <u>mornings, please time your arrival for 8.30 – 8.40am.</u>

Access to Classrooms After Hours

With the exception of those attending Extra-Curricular Activities, *children are not permitted to re-enter the classroom after 2.10pm.* If in an absolute emergency (*forgotten books, copies and general belongings does not generally constitute an emergency!*) a child needs to gain access to his/her classroom outside school hours, he/she should come to Reception.

Letters of Attendance

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Absences due to illness

Whilst there is no need to telephone the school if your child is sick, we would greatly appreciate if you would contact us if your child contracts a contagious illness e.g. measles, mumps, rubella, etc. There are children in the school who are at increased risk of contracting these illnesses. Parents <u>must</u> acknowledge their child's absence from school, <u>in writing</u>, at the back of the child's School Journal (Education Welfare Act). Parents of Infants children should speak to the teacher at the class line on the morning of their return.

Sick Children at School

Please do not send sick children to school for the following reasons:

- Children are unable to cope with the demands of school when they are unwell.
- Infection spreads rapidly in the confinement of the classroom.
- There is no indoor supervision for sick children during breaktimes.

Covid

Covid is once again circulating widely among the school community. We can only share information about cases by text, of we are informed. The Covid isolation rules for positive cases has not changed recently.

As per current HSE guidance, children should:

• remain at home for 7 days (day 0= onset of symptoms OR positive test)

AND

• must be 48 hours recovered from substantial symptoms.

Parking

The Gardaí and local residents have again approached the school regarding the issue of **dangerous** and **illegal parking**. We appreciate that lack of parking space is a major problem for all parents. However, cars must be parked in a safe, legal and considerate manner. Unfortunately, a number of parents continue to park and block access to/from driveways, and park dangerously close to junctions and entrances to estates. This is both highly inconsiderate towards the residents of these estates and is, in fact, illegal.

There are also a number of parents who stop at the roundabout on the main road which is also a *dangerous and illegal practice*. It is also an unnecessary practice as we have a safe procedure in place for dropping children off at the main entrance of the school. The following are extracts from the *Rules of the Road*:

- 1. A vehicle may not park on double yellow lines in any circumstances.
- 2. A vehicle may not be parked within <u>5m</u> of a junction.
- 3. Vehicles may not be parked near: <u>a bend</u>, <u>the brow of a hill</u>, a humped back bridge, <u>a</u> continuous <u>white line</u>, where it would obstruct a sign, at an entrance, at a bus stop or opposite another vehicle on a narrow road.

The Board of Management will have no hesitation in supporting local residents who choose to report drivers who park illegally or trespass on their property. The Board will also support those parents who choose to report instances of dangerous parking that may put the lives of their children at risk.

There is ample parking available at Spar car park which is a short distance from the school. Cars must be parked **properly** in the car park. **Under no circumstances should a car obstruct one of their patrons** or interfere with delivery truck access.
